Our proven leadership program prepares you for a top role in Agriculture in just two years.

Applications for the 2020-2022 program will be taken starting February 1st, 2020. Check our website for more details.

Participants are chosen through a competitive review and interview process. Approximately 25 applicants will be chosen for the class beginning in October, 2020.

What you'll do in our two-year program:

Seven three-day sessions in NC focused on personal and civic leadership development.

Study tour to Washington, D.C. to learn about agricultural policy.

A domestic study tour to learn about U.S. agriculture.

An international study tour focusing on global agriculture.

The N.C. Tobacco Trust Fund Commission
Agricultural Leadership Development Program began
in 1984 as a leadership program for flue-cured
tobacco farmers. Today, it is a nationally-recognized
program for agriculturalists of all kinds who come to
us to become strong leaders.

With more than 250 graduates from our program, we encourage the development of personal and civic leadership skills, including mastering self, conflict resolution, crucial conversations, negotiation, and team building. Participants experience in-depth personal leadership assessments and coaching to assist in understanding the results.
